Kenneth Minogue is one of the foremost political theorists of the post-war period. Professor Minogue began his teaching career at the University of Exeter before moving to the London School of Economics where he was made a senior lecturer. In addition to his teaching, Professor Minogue was the director of Government and Opposition for the Centre for Policy Studies, the chairman for the euroskeptic Bruges Group from 1991-1993, and President of the legendary Mount Pelerin Society from 2010-2012. Professor Minogue has written a number of well-received treatises, including *Alien Powers: The Pure Theory of Ideology* and his most recent work, *The Servile Mind: How Democracy Erodes the Moral Life*.
